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## ADMISSION TO BACHELOR OF ARTS (B.A.) & BACHELOR OF COMMERCE (B.COM)

### ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION

\*An applicant having passed 10+2 examination or equivalent with English as one of the subjects with minimum 33% marks from any Board/University recognized by Association of Indian Universities or H.P. University can seek admission.

\*Provided that the candidates who have passed the qualifying examination with commerce stream or Economics or Maths shall be given preference in admission to B.Com.

\*Applicants coming from vocational streams can be admitted if they possess the required minimum percentage for admission.

\*Admission will not be given to students placed under compartment in 10+2 examination.

\*An applicant must not be more than 23 years of age (25 years in case of girls and 26 years for SC/ST category) on 01.07.2023.

However, in case of overage applicants, vice-chancellor H.P. University may allow a relaxation up to six months.

\*The admission will be purely on the basis of merit of the previous qualifying examination.

\*Number of seats in each faculty is 80 and can be changed according to the availability of teachers and infrastructure.

\*The reservation roster for various categories will be followed as per H.P. University guidelines.

\*Reserved seats meant for SC/ST categories if remain unfilled will thereafter be offered and filled from open category but only on the basis of merit

\*National Open School students must have cleared all the five papers including English.

\*Initially all admissions shall be provisional and subject to the final approval by HPU.

\*No admission will be granted after the last date of admission.

\*Rules of admission are subject to change as per HPU notification.

\*B.A/B.COM IInd and IIIrd year students will seek admission on "ROLL ON" basis and will write "Result Awaited" for the previous year examination passed column. And will get the form verified and approval by the admission committee. "ROLL-ON" means the student seeking admission in Higher class without waiting for the declaration of previous class examination result; such student if eligible, will be regularized only after the declaration of previous year examination as per the university rules.

\*The Principal reserves the right to disallow or cancel any admission if the conduct of the student has not been up to the mark.

### CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM (CBCS) Regulation

In year 2013 Choice Based Credit System was introduced for undergraduate courses in Arts, Science and commerce. Further in the year 2016 the new Choice Based Credit System was introduced in

accordance with UGC Guidelines. Further in the year 2018 the annual system of Choice Based Credit System was introduced.

The CBCS provides an opportunity for the students to choose courses from the prescribed courses comprising core, elective and skill based courses. The courses can be evaluated following the grading system, which is considered to be better than the conventional marks system. Therefore, it is necessary to introduce uniform grading system in the entire higher education in India. This will benefit the students to move across institutions within India to begin with and across countries. The uniform grading system will also enable potential employers in assessing the performance of the candidates. In order to bring uniformity in evaluation system and computation of the Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) based on student's performance in examinations, the UGC has formulated the guidelines to be followed.

### **Outline of Choice Based Credit System**

**1. Discipline Specific Core (DSC) Course:** A course, which should compulsorily be studied by a candidate as a core requirement is termed as a Core course.

**2. Elective Course:** Generally a course which can be chosen from a pool of courses and which may be very specific or specialized or advanced or supportive to the discipline/ subject of study or which provides an extended scope or which enables an exposure to some other discipline/subject/domain or nurtures the candidate's proficiency/skill is called an Elective Course.

- **Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) Course (2 each for regular courses):** Elective courses may be offered by the main discipline/subject of study is referred to as Discipline Specific Elective. The University/Institute may also offer discipline related Elective courses of interdisciplinary nature (to be offered by main discipline/subject of study).
- **Dissertation/Project Work:** An elective course of 4 credits, designed to acquire special/advanced knowledge, such as supplement study/support study to a project work, and a candidate studies such a course on his own with an advisory support by a teacher/faculty member is called dissertation/project work. A Project/Dissertation work may be given in lieu of a discipline specific elective paper.
- **Generic Elective Course (GEC):** An elective course chosen generally from an unrelated discipline/subject, with an intention to seek exposure to other subjects/disciplines is called a Generic Elective Course.

**NOTE:-**A Course offered in a discipline/subject may be treated as an elective by other discipline/subject

and vice-versa and such electives may also be referred to Generic Elective Course.

**3. Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC)/Competency Improvement Courses/Skill Development Courses/Foundation Course:** The Ability Enhancement (AE) Courses may be of two kinds: AE Compulsory Course (AECC) and AE Elective Course (AEEC). "AECC" courses are the courses based upon the content that leads to Knowledge enhancement. They [(i) Environmental Science, (ii) English/Hindi/MIL Communication] are mandatory for all disciplines. AEEC courses are value-based and/or skill-based and are aimed at providing hands-on-training, competencies, skills, etc.

- **Ability Enhancement Compulsory Course (AECC):** Environmental Science, English Communication/Hindi Communication /MIL Communication.
- **Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) (Minimum 4):** These courses may be chosen from a pool of courses designed to provide value-based and/or skill-based knowledge and are aimed at providing hands-on-training, competencies, skill etc. to increase the employability of student.

**Duration (Time Frame):** The UG programme is for a minimum period of three years from the date of admission of the candidate.

**Content Hours:** Each course has five lecture and one tutorial (per group) per week in case of DSC,DSE and GE Courses-Each course has four lecture and two practical(per group) per week in case of SEC courses.

**Credits:** The term 'credit' refers to the weight age given to a course, usually in term of the number of instructional hours per week assigned to it. This explains why usually 'credit' is taken to mean 'credit hours'. The credit also determines the volume of course contents and delivery of programme such as lectures tutorial, practical, assignment etc.

The totals of minimum credits required for an undergraduate degree programme is one hundred and thirty two (132).

**Notes:**

A candidate failing in either one or two subjects/papers in yearly system will be given compartment in that subject/paper and will be eligible for promotion to the next class. Two chances (one at supplementary stage and one at the annual exam stage) will be given to clear the compartment. A candidate failing in three or more subjects/papers will be treated as “failed” in that year and will be required to repeat the entire year.

Earning 132 credits fulfils the requirement of RUSA and UGC.

#### **CONTINUOUS COMPREHENSIVE ASSESSMENT (CCA) AND EVALUATION**

- All courses (Compulsory, Core, Elective, and GI & H courses) involve an evaluation system of students that has the following two components:-
  - Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA) accounting for 30% of the final grade student get in a course; and
  - End- Year Examination (EYE) accounting for the remaining 70% of the final grade the student to get in a course.
- Overall Pass marks are 40%. However, a student will have to secure a minimum of 35% in both the components i.e. CCA and EYE separately with to become eligible to be declared successful in a course.

#### **CONTINUOUS COMPREHENSIVE ASSESSMENT (CCA)**

Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA) will have the following co-component:

**Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA):** CCA accounts for 30% of the final grade that a student gets in a course of a study. This would have the following components:

- i) **Classroom Attendance:** Each student will have to attend a minimum of 75% lectures/Tutorials / Practical. A student having less than 75% attendance will not be allowed to appear in the final examination.
- ii) Provided that those having between 74% and 65% attendance will apply for exemption in a prescribed form accompanied by clear reason(s) for absence to the authorized functionaries.
- iii) Provided that those having between 64% and 50 % attendance will apply for exemption in a prescribed form accompanied by a medical certificate from a Government Hospital.
- iv) Provided that exemption from 75% attendance will be given to those participation prescribed co-curricular activities (e.g. NSS, Youth Festivals, Sports, etc.) to the extent of 25% (making the necessary attendance as 50% in these cases). However, the claim for this exemption should be supported by authenticated certificate from the concerned college authorities.
- v) Provided further that those getting the exemptions, except for those getting exemptions for curricular activities, will not be entitled for getting the CCA marks for classroom attendance as given below.
- vi) **Classroom Attendance Incentive:** Those having greater than 75% attendance) for participating in Co-curricular activities, 25% will be added to per cent attendance) will be a CCA marks as follows:-

**Mid-Term Test-** There will be one mid- term test of 10 marks to be conducted when approximately two-third of the Syllabus has been covered. This test will be conducted by the college.

**Seminar/ Assignments** - The remaining 10 marks of CCA will be awarded on the basis of seminar / assignments/term paper etc. it. For the Yearly the EYA will be in the month of April/May.

**End-Year Examination (EYE)-** The remaining 70% of final grade of 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Year students in a course will be on the basis of an end Annual examination that will be of three hours duration and covering the whole syllabus of a course.

**Note1.** Only those students will be allowed to appear in EYE (end-year exams) who have been successful in the CCA.

- 2. The registration for the EYE will be done at the time of enrollment for the courses at the beginning of the semester or as decided by the university from time to time.
- 3. If a student is not permitted to appear in the EYE due to shortage of attendance, beyond the examination limit (<50% attendance) shall be deemed to have 'dropped' the course. However such candidate, on his/ her written request to be made immediately, can be permitted to re-do the missed semester after completing the rest of the programme or

whenever the course is offered subsequently. This redoing would mean complete course including CCA and EYE.

4. A candidate failing in either one or two subjects/papers will be given compartment/will be eligible for promotion/will get 2 more chances one at supplementary and other at annual stage). Students shall be required to complete the degree within 5 years from the date of admission.
5. The minimum passing marks will be 40% aggregate. However 35% each in IA and final exams will be compulsory.
6. Re-evaluation shall be applicable as per provisions of HPU.

#### **GENERAL GUIDELINES FOR ADMISSIONS TO BACHELOR'S DEGREE**

- Admission to various classes will be made on the recommendation of the admission committee constituted for the purpose.
- Any gap of one year or more in the academic career of an applicant just prior to seeking admission to the Bachelor Degree course must be supported by documentary evidence of attested copy of gap certificate from a competent authority and character certificate from a class-I gazetted officer or Panchayat Pradhan of village.
- An applicant must fill the admission form in his / her own hand writing and should be complete in all respects supported by following documents:-
  - (i) Three passport size photographs;
  - (ii) Attested copy of Matriculation Certificate.
  - (iii) Attested copy of detail Marks Card of 10+2/ previous examination passed.
  - (iv) Character Certificate in original from the Institution last attended or by some H. P Govt. Gazetted class-I officer.
  - (v) Attested copy of category Certificate for claiming benefits.
  - (vi) Migration certificate if from different boards/university.
  - (vii) Bonafide Himachali certificate for girls.
- All the original certificates must be produced by an applicant during the selection process.
- Candidate coming from different Boards/Universities must attach original Migration certificate before the admission committee.
- National Open School students seeking admission to the 1 year of Bachelor Degree must have cleared all the five papers including English.
- If a candidate has failed twice in the same class, he/ she will not get admission in the same class.
- If the conduct of a candidate is doubtful, the principal can deny his/her admission.



- Initially all admissions shall be provisional/ and subject to the final approval by HPU.
- Rule of admission subject to change as per the HPU notification issued for time to time.
- Admission of a candidate is liable to be cancelled in case he/ she furnishes incomplete/false information or in case of concealment of facts.
- Decide your subject combination personally after taking guidance from the teachers.
- For any clarification/guidance, the applicant can approach **admission guidance committee** of the college.

#### **ADMISSION PROCEDURE & INSTRUCTIONS**

- Fill up the application form in your own handwriting and get it signed by your parent/ local guardian.
- Bring your parent/guardian at the time of admission
- Bring **ORIGINAL** and Photostat copies of relevant certificates; photographs; original migration (if other board than HPBOSE); an affidavit from court in case of gap of one or more years (after 10+2).
- No student of the college should sign in place of parent/guardian of any applicant. Otherwise none of the two will be admitted in the college.
- Appear for interview personally before the admission Committee, Screening Committee and Principal.
- For fee and funds, consult the fee chart.
- Pay the dues personally in office.
- Make sure you get your fee receipt, after payment before leaving the office.

#### **LEAVE RULE AND FINE**

- A student can proceed on leave with prior permission from the Principal, but the application should also be signed by the parents/guardian of the student and duly recommended by the tutor.
- A Tutor can recommend leave up to maximum of five days and leaves for longer duration will be sanctioned by the Principal.
- Leave during House Examination will be sanctioned by the Principal on the recommendation of the senior tutor in special cases only.
- Leave on account of illness, if it is for more than three days, must be accompanied by the medical certificate.

- Students participating in various inter college games or other competitions including NSS camps, tracking tour etc. Will have to get their leave sanctioned by the college Principal on the recommendation of their in charges concerned before the departure.
- The name of student shall be struck off from the college Roll, if he/she remains absent without sanctioned leave for continuous 10 days or more than 10 days in a month.
- **The re-admission** fee shall be Rs. 100/- for the first time and Rs. 200/- will be charged for the second time on the recommendation of concerned teacher.
- **For seeking re-admission** the candidate must be accompanied by her/his parent or guardian.
- A student without college identity card in the college campus will be imposed a fine of Rs. 50.

**Other fines will be given below:**

Absence per period: Rs. 1/-

Absence in House Test: Rs. 50 per paper

**Please Note** that General leave will only be counted for the relaxation in fine only and not to be counted as the lecture attended. In case of participation in sports, cultural, other activities credit will be given to the students and to be counted as lecture attended.

### **SCHOLARSHIPS /CONCESSIONS**

The college offers the following Scholarships and concessions:

- Govt. Of India scholarships to students belonging to Scheduled caste/Schedule Tribe.
  - Poverty cum merit scholarships
  - I. R. D. P Scholarships
  - Maharishi Balmiki Chhatravriti Yojna to the girl students belonging to the families of those engaged in unclean occupations.
  - Kalpana Chawla Chatervriti Yojna for Meritorious Girl Students
  - Government of India Scholarships for students belonging to minority community.
7. Dr. Ambedkar Scholarship for Economically Backward classes.

\*It two male wards of the same parent are getting education in the college, only one will be eligible for the scholarship.

\*Fee concession will be given to the poor but brilliant students on the recommendation of fee concession committee. If two brothers are studying in the college, only senior one will be considered for the concession.

\*The scholarships are awarded to the students as per norms and rules prescribed by the department. \*The students will have to apply for scholarship through an application recommended the tutor and submit in the college office. Only those students who are regular in the college rolls (her/his name should not be struck off from the college roll and should have at least 75% lecture attendance) and have obtained minimum. Passing marks in all subjects in the house/ annual examination are eligible for the award of scholarship/concession.

As per the Govt. Instructions, the scholarship will be disbursed online to the eligible students and it is mandatory to have **Aadhar Number, Passbook, Father's income certificate, Category Certificate(if any)** for such scholarship holders. **The Bank Account should be linked to Aadhar number.**

Students must contact the scholarship committee before applying.

## **LIBRARY**

The college has started its book bank and there are books on different subjects. It subscribes one daily newspaper and one magazine. Books are issued only on the production of identity card.

The college has requested to the directorate of higher education for the sufficient fund for the purchase of reference books as well.

## **TUTORIAL GROUPS**

Tutorial groups are formed in the college to ensure the closer interaction between the teacher and the taught and will provide opportunity to students to exhibit their creative potential and share their problems and difficulties which otherwise remain dormant. Each tutorial group will be guided by a member of the faculty. There will be 30 to 40 students in a group.

## **ANNUAL PRIZE DISTRIBUTION FUNCTION**

Annual Prize Distribution Function is an occasion to boost the morale and award those students who excel in various fields/activities. The rules for the prizes will be notified by August/September.

## **SPORTS AND CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES**

The college provides facilities to sports persons who wish to make a mark in games/sports. The disciplines in which the college plans to prepare teams for University Championships are: Athletics, Badminton, Kho-Kho, Volleyball and Chess. A committee of teachers will decide the formalities of teams to represent the college in different events. The college provides various incentives for students participating in competition held at University/State/National level.

The college provides guidance to students for participating in various activities. Students are advised to join at least one of the clubs/cell like **Red Ribbon Club** that aims to educate and sensitise youth and general public against AIDS or **Eco-Club** that makes us aware about the importance of nurturing our environment or Red Ribbon Club (being run in collaboration with local Red Cross unit) aiming to promote health & hygiene etc. Or **Career Guidance, Counselling and Placement Cell**, helping

students in career building, enhancing communication skills, personality development etc. Or **women cell** catering to the problems/grievances especially of girl students.

The college provides a platform to aspirants for participation in **debate, declamation, quiz, poetic symposium, painting, poster making, rangoli and collage making** etc.

### **COMMUNITY PARTICIATION/PTA**

The Parent Teacher Association is a statutorily constituted elected body. The PTA plans and undertakes development works in the college and focuses the overall development and improvement of educational standards. The parents make contribution to PTA at the time of admission of their wards. PTA is run by the Executive Committee which takes all the decisions.

### **COLLEGE MAGAZINE**

The college publishes its magazine "**Abhinandan**" annually which provides a forum to the students with a flair for writing. It provides suitable platform to explore creative thoughts of students.

### **CONDUCT AND DISCIPLINE**

- Every student must carry his/her college Identity Card, which is issued to the students after the admission.
- Any act of ragging on the campus will be severely dealt with. Ragging means and includes any type of physical and mental torture, done by any individual or group either by words/conduct/action which gives an apprehension in mind of a person that he/she cannot pursue studies.
- Following nefarious acts will be considered as acts of gross misconduct and indiscipline and can lead to fine or suspension/expulsion or both:
  - Bringing outsiders, miscreants or anti-social elements in the campus.
  - Using mobile phones in the classroom/playing music on cell phone in the campus.
  - Misbehaving with the college staff.
  - Holding of any meeting in the campus without prior permission from the Principal.
  - Any attempt to damage the furniture/other property of the college.
  - Pasting notices/posters without permission of the Principal
  - Smoking taking Drugs/alcohols etc
- Parents/Guardians are requested to remain in touch with the Principal and the teachers regarding the progress of their wards.
- Students who participate in sports or other extracurricular activities must produce written permission from their parents / guardians.
- Cell phones are not allowed during House and final examination. Penalty/ fine of Rs. 100/- will be imposed on violators (first time) and same will be increased thereafter.
